Not only will the NEI Center employ and attract world-class physicians and related healthcare professionals, but it will attract patients to the area who will be in need of accommodations and ancillary services in the area surrounding the Center.

Most persons with Chronic Fatigue Syndrome are currently being undertreated for their illness. We look forward to the day when the NEI Center opens its doors so that we may avail ourselves of its services.
